History

We will be examining the lives of children over the last two hundred years. This will include hands on evidence and the use of primary sources from the Victorian era to refugees and evacuees in WW2.

We will end up looking at the changes for children the 60s brought about. As part of a living history activity, children will get the chance to interview relatives and record their findings.

This term in Science the children will be studying 'Living Things and their Habitats'. Throughout the term we will consider what makes a 'thing' a living thing and look at elements of MRS NERG (the fundamentals for all living things). Taking on the role of Taxonomists, we will look in depth at the characteristics of different vertebrates and invertebrates, with particular emphasis on Mammals. We will begin to use branching diagrams, Venn diagrams and classification keys to help identify, describe and classify living things. The children will also consider environmental issues relating to living things, particularly the current situation with the plastic pollution in our oceans.
