Our Vision for Millhouse Primary School

At Millhouse Primary School we strive for all our pupils to leave us with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport. We believe PE and Sport play a crucial role in the development of positive attitudes and behaviour for learning.

Sports Premium Grant

The PE and Sport Premium Grant is devolved funding from central government. This funding must be used to fund improvements to the provision of PE and sport for the benefit of pupils aged 5 – 11 years old in the 2015 – 2016 academic year so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles. In 2015 – 16, schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £8,000 and an additional payment of £5 per pupil.

‘Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this’ (DfE June 2013).

We welcome the Government’s initiative to provide additional funding to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. Following the appointment of a new headteacher in January 2016, money has been allocated to conduct a full audit of current sports provision and a new sports premium spending plan has been drawn up utilising the current funding allocation for 2015-16 and the balance from the previous carry forward.

At Millhouse Primary School we have allocated the funding to three key areas for consideration: Physical Education, Healthy Active Lifestyles and Competitive Sport.
